WHAT MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID COVERS

- Common signs and symptoms of mental health challenges in this age group, including anxiety, depression, eating disorders and attention deficit hyperactive disorder (ADHD).
- · Common signs and symptoms of substance use challenges.
- · How to interact with a child or adolescent in crisis.
- How to connect the youth with help.
- Expanded content on trauma, substance use, self-care and the impact of social media and bullying.

THREE WAYS TO LEARN

- In-person (2nd Edition) Learners receive their training during a 6.5-hour, Instructor-led, in-person session.

Purpose of Committee:

Texas Education Code Chapter 37.109 requires all School Districts to establish a safety committee. Senate Bill 11 amended responsibilities and members' responsibilities:

- Develop and Implement the Multi-Hazard Emergency Operation Plan
- Provide Guidance and Support

The next meeting of the Brownwood Independent School District Safety and Security Committee Meeting will be held on February 12^{th} at 5:30PM at 2707 Southside Drive, Brownwood, Texas.

Agenda Items:

- 1. Safety and Security Facilities Update:
 - BISD construction update Waldrop Construction Co. will start on March 1st on the BHS indoor facility. There will be a pre-construction meeting with HS administration to go over any safety concerns before construction starts.
 - Tennis court fencing will be completed after the bleachers are done.
 Looking mid-March for completion of metal 6 feet high fencing to match what is already there in other areas.
 - District maps in the process -researching companies (to better meet our needs-want map co. to visit sight so maps ae more to scale and maps have all campus details)
 - Currently using Safety Map LLC
 - Safety Grant submitted -
 - Completion exterior protective glass, emergency responder access (Knox boxes with keys to buildings), exterior door latches checked and are secure (weekly door audits - doors are reported if need repair), interior door labeling
 - Progress intercom system, panic buttons
 - o Needs exterior door numbering, campus maps
 - Radios delivery date April Company HCI in Sugar Land, TX

Are the exterior windows going to be numbered? Currently, they are not required from the state. District will investigate this process.
